1. A godly father needs to know the heavenly Father.

"I will be a Father to you, And you shall be My sons and daughters, Says the LORD Almighty." 2 Corinthians 6:18

2. A godly has the power to break the cycle inherited from previous generations.

"If, however, he begets a son who sees all the sins which his father has done, and considers but does not do likewise; Ezekiel 18:14

"Those from among you shall build the old waste places; You shall raise up the foundations of many generations; And you shall be called the Repairer of the Breach, The Restorer of Streets to Dwell In." Isaiah 58:12

3. A godly father must first be a godly man.

A Pew Research Center study of 130 countries shows that the U.S. has the highest rate of children in single-parent households:

Most research points to two major causes for the growth in fatherlessness since the early 1960s: divorce and out-of-wedlock births.

4. A godly father must turn his heart toward his children.

"And he will turn the hearts of the fathers to the children, and the hearts of the children to their fathers, lest I come and strike the earth with a curse." Malachi 4:6

Turn your heart toward children by:

- Love their mother.
- Love and care for them (Ps 103:13; Jn 16:27; 1 Jn 3:1)
- Provide for them (Mt 7:7-11)

- Discipline them (Prov 12:11; 13:24; 22:15)
- Don't provoke them to anger (Eph 6:4)
