1. The Purpose of Prayer

- When we humble ourselves and pray, we bring Heaven to earth.
- The heart of prayer is to align with the will of God and to manifest the Kingdom of God on earth.
- John 6:40 explains God's will, and Romans 14:17-18 describes the Kingdom of God as righteousness, peace, and joy in the Holy Spirit.

2. The Power of Sacrifice and Prayer

- For a living sacrifice to release its scent, there must be heat—this heat comes from the fervency of prayer.
- As living sacrifices, we must be set on fire by Heaven to release the fragrance of God wherever we go.
- Lukewarm living produces no fragrance; sin is the snare that hinders prayer.
- o If your prayer life lacks passion, it may be dampened by sin, compromise, or laziness.

3. Spiritual Warfare and Fire

- Spiritual warfare involves the active cooperation of mankind as both the Kingdom of Heaven and the forces of hell seek to manifest through us.
- Fire causes manifestation: You are either set on fire by hell (through pride, fear, and offense) or by Heaven (through faith, prayer, and humility).
- Perseverance in prayer is essential for bringing Heaven to earth. Examples include Elijah, Daniel, and Jesus—all of whom persevered in prayer.





4. Maintaining the Fire of God

- o To stay ablaze with God's glory, we must resolutely resist and refuse doubts.
- No one is greater than their prayer life.
- o In every situation, God has something to say; His opinion settles all things.
- We are designed to think, talk, and act with God. This alignment is crucial in our daily battle against our senses.

5. The Essence of True Prayer

- Prayer is more than just saying words; it is the act of praying with sincerity and faith.
- The power of prayer lies not in the words themselves, but in the heart and mind engaged in the act of praying.
- The Lord's Prayer teaches us a pattern of thinking that transforms our minds and renews us.
