



"Sing, O barren, you who have not borne! break forth into singing, and cry aloud, you who have not labored with child! For more are the children of the desolate Than the children of the married woman," says the LORD. Isaiah 54:1

"Enlarge the place of your tent, and let them stretch out the curtains of your dwellings; do not spare; lengthen your cords, and strengthen your stakes. Isaiah 54:2

1. You must stretch your curtains when God starts enlarging your tent.

Stretching releases the supernatural.

Then He said to the man, "Stretch out your hand." And he stretched it out, and it was restored as whole as the other. Matthew 12:13

Faith is like a rubber band; it lies dormant until it's stretched.

2. God wants to take you from enlargement to expansion.

When God enlarges you - bigger tent.
When God expands you - bigger territory.

What God wants to do in 2025:

- * Enlarge your tent
- * Expand you to the right and left
- * Empower the next generation.
- * Enrich empty cities.

3. God is the source of whatever resource you are lacking.

Faith bursts forth in praise, not in panic. (Is 54:1)

Faith trusts God's truth above what appears to be true. (Is 54:2-4)

Faith may feel fear, but it doesn't feed it.

Fear feeds on the personal failures of yesterday.



Fear feeds on a three-course meal: people's opinions about you as the appetizer, your circumstances as the main course, and your feelings as the dessert—served by the devil himself.

And I was afraid, and went and hid your talent in the ground. Look, there you have what is yours.'
Matthew 25:25

Twenty years from now, you will be more disappointed by the things you didn't do than by the things you did.

For your Maker is your husband, the LORD of hosts is His name; and your Redeemer is the Holy One of Israel; He is called the God of the whole earth. Isaiah 54:5
