

1. God's Provision is on the Way

- Joseph's wagons were a sign of his faithfulness to his family—God does the same for us.
- Even when we don't see it, God is dispatching resources, opportunities, and breakthroughs.
- Testimony: Financial provision for the church's building project—God supplies our needs.
- The call: Open our eyes to the "wagons" God is sending in our own lives.

2. Spiritual Warfare & Advancing God's Kingdom

- Whenever the church expands, opposition increases—especially in strategic regions like Kennewick.
- The last few months have brought intense spiritual resistance, but we sense breakthrough.
- The enemy fights hardest when God is moving—yet the victory is already secured.
- The wagons have been dispatched—reinforcements are on the way!

3. Generosity & Kingdom Partnership

- Some of the provision God has sent is already in our hands.
- A challenge to the congregation: Ask God what He is calling you to contribute.
- Specific needs: Fire sprinklers, new church locations (Everett & Spokane).
- Ways to give: Online, in-person, and even legacy giving (wills, estates).
- Giving is not about loss—it's about participation in God's provision.

4. Apostolic Calling & The Antioch Model

- Acts 13:1-3: The church at Antioch sent out Paul and Barnabas for global impact.
- The call of Hungry Generation: Not just to grow, but to send and plant.
- We must be a church that listens to the Holy Spirit and responds with bold faith.
- God's vision is bigger than one city—He is raising up pioneers for His Kingdom.

5. Stepping Into God's Calling

- Comfort is the enemy of calling.
- The local church is not just a gathering place—it's a launchpad.
- A mindset of multiplication: God is calling us to expand His Kingdom, not just maintain it.

6. Multiplication Happens When You Give It Away

- The disciples saw lack, but Jesus saw opportunity.
- Jesus blessed what they had, and as they gave, it multiplied.





Principle: God's blessing comes when we release what He has given us.

7. Overflow Comes After Obedience

- The disciples gave their all, yet they were not left empty.
- Instead, they had more than enough—12 baskets of leftovers!
- Obedience leads to supernatural provision and spiritual rest.

8. Sowing vs. Losing

- Losing: When resources are wasted (e.g., gambling, bad decisions).
- Sowing: When resources are given into God's Kingdom, it's an investment, not a loss.
- Releasing leaders isn't losing them—it's planting them for greater impact.

9. Releasing to Make Room for More

- When the disciples let go of their little, God multiplied it.
- In ministry: Leaders must be sent so new leaders can rise.
- In giving: Finances increase when given in faith.
- If we hold onto what God calls us to release, we limit what He wants to do next.

10. A Call to Obedience

- Isaiah 6:8—Isaiah said, "Here I am, send me!"
- Jonah resisted God's call—let's not be like Jonah!
- Every generation faces a defining moment of obedience—this is ours.
- Will we step into the wagons God is sending, or will we resist His move?
