

Psalm 92:10 – “I have been anointed with fresh oil.”

1 Samuel 16:13 – David is anointed by Samuel.

1 Samuel 17:33-39 – David defeats Goliath by removing Saul’s armor.

2 Samuel 2:4; 5:3; 5:6; 6:20 – David is anointed in public and fulfills God’s purpose.

2 Corinthians 1:21 – God anoints and establishes us in Christ.

1 Corinthians 16:13 – Stand firm in the faith.

Ephesians 6:13 – Put on the full armor of God.

The Antidote to Impossibility

David’s life was filled with discouragement: Saul doubted him, the Jebusites mocked him, and even Michal despised him. Yet he overcame.

Key Truth: Through Jesus Christ, you are anointed to prove hell wrong. This anointing is not just to survive but to demonstrate God’s power in your life.

1. Fresh Oil: Anointed From the Inside Out

- The anointing is the Holy Spirit, heaven’s authority flowing through you.
- It empowers you to fulfill God’s purposes and occupy His promises.
- This is God’s “super” over your natural”, enabling you to experience the supernatural.

We are anointed to:

- Shout down walls, bring down giants, pray down fire.
- Cast out demons, heal the sick, and speak truth with love.
- Advance God’s Kingdom on earth.

The anointing flows from the inside out, not just a dab but a full outpouring. A new generation is rising that refuses half-measures—they want full transformation.

2. Fresh Oil: Anointed to Bring Down Generational Giants

David’s anointing pattern:

- Anointed privately before public recognition.
- Anointed to serve before leading.
- Anointed in the presence of family before enemies.
- Anointed to wait before winning.

Our generational giants today:

- Family giants: depression, anxiety, fear, addiction.
- Societal giants: abortion, racism, human trafficking, attacks on children.

Stand Firm:

We don’t lean left or right; we stand on God’s Word, defending truth, righteousness, and justice in every sphere—church, home, school, workplace, and public square.





3. Fresh Oil: Anointed by Removing Saul's Armor

Lesson from 1 Samuel 17: David removed Saul's armor because it didn't fit.

Application:

- Don't wear someone else's anointing, expectations, or limitations.
- Remove man-made burdens, toxic labels, and false identities.
- God's plan is unique—only His glory should shine.

God's anointing cannot coexist with man's armor. Remove what others place on you to walk fully in your God-given purpose.

4. Characteristics of the Anointed

- Do not whine; worship.
- Focus on the light, not the darkness.
- Make history, not excuses.
- Walk in supernatural authority to:
 - Shout down walls.
 - Bring down giants.
 - Pray down fire.
 - Cast out demons.

5. You Are Anointed

- To prove hell wrong.
- To bring down generational giants.
- To occupy all of God's promises.
- To fill your world with the glory of Jesus Christ.

Still Standing

Like David, your private battles—depression, betrayal, brokenness—prepare you for public victories.

You stand because:

- Greater is He that is in you than he that is in the world (1 John 4:4).
- God's Word never fails.
- Every giant has been defeated by Jesus on the cross.
