



Key Scriptures

- **Joel 2:28–29 / Acts 2:17–18** — “I will pour out My Spirit on all flesh... even on servants...”
- **Genesis 16** — Hagar meets “the God who sees”
- **Genesis 21:14–19** — God hears Ishmael’s cry and provides water
- **Isaiah 60:1–3** — “Arise, shine... darkness covers the earth...”
- **John 10:27–29** — “No one can snatch them out of My hand” (identity/security in Christ)

God has an appointed time to pour out His Spirit on **all humanity**, and the speaker connects “even on servants” to **Hagar/Ishmael**—saying God is moving powerfully among Muslims through dreams, visions, salvation, and a global harvest.

Simple Sermon Outline

1) We Are Living in a Unique End-Time Moment

- The world is shifting, and God is moving in fresh ways
- “Last days” = a season where God pours out His Spirit widely
- A prophetic wave is increasing (dreams, visions, gifts)

Main takeaway: Don’t ignore what God is doing right now.

2) God Works by Appointed Times

- The speaker explains **kairos** (appointed/hidden time) vs **chronos** (linear time)
- God releases certain things “in season,” and He doesn’t change His mind about it

Main takeaway: What God promised, He fulfills—on His timetable.

3) “Even on Servants” — Hagar and Ishmael Matter in God’s Story

- Hagar is highlighted as the “servant” connected to Abraham’s tent
- God sees Hagar, speaks covenant, and gives a future
- Ishmael’s name is emphasized: **God hears**
- In the wilderness crisis, Ishmael cries and **God responds** with provision

Main takeaway: God hears the cry of the overlooked and the rejected.

4) The Speaker’s Claim: God Is Drawing Muslims to Jesus

- The message says many believers avoid Muslims out of fear or lack of preparation
- The speaker calls for “special forces”—trained believers to reach Muslims
- Emphasis: dreams/visions + the Spirit’s outpouring = harvest

Main takeaway: The Church must be equipped and willing, not intimidated.

5) Testimony: From Violence and Bondage to Redemption in Jesus

- The speaker shares a life story: pain, manipulation, terrorism, spiritual emptiness
- A turning point: brokenness and a suicidal moment
- He describes hearing a voice calling him to the “God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob”
- He describes encountering Jesus and being transformed—healed and given a new heart
- Commission: not to die, but to live as an **ambassador** and reach others



Main takeaway: Jesus doesn't just forgive—He transforms identity and destiny.

6) Response: Today Is the Day of Salvation

- Call to come forward, receive prayer, return home to God
- Identity declarations: chosen, royal priesthood, temple of the Holy Spirit
- Freedom language: "It is finished... set free... bondage broken"
- Leads people in a salvation prayer and prays healing/deliverance

Main takeaway: Don't delay—respond to Jesus today.
