How to Have Daily Encounters?

- Talk to God in prayer
- Hear His voice through His word and Spirit
- Encounter His presence in worship

“You choose your daily encounter, but God chooses your holy visitation.” Landon Schott

Encounters are chosen by us, visitations are chosen by God.

Encounters are relational, visitations are directional.

Encounters require pursuit, visitations require obedience.

Encounters grow intimacy, visitations change your assignment.

Encounters change your perception, visitations release God’s purpose.

Encountering God is a decision driven by desire, strengthened by discipline.

Daily encounters with God are not just spiritual daily habits. They are strategic investments.

The Power of Daily Encounters:

1. Strength — For the New Role You’re Stepping Into

“Be strong and very courageous...” (Joshua 1:6, 7, 9)

Daily encounters renew strength so you don’t collapse under the weight of the next assignment.

2. Sword (Sanctification) — God Personally Dealing with You

And Joshua said to the people, ‘Sanctify yourselves, for tomorrow the LORD will do wonders among you.’ Joshua 3:5

Daily encounters sharpen spiritual sensitivity.
