



1. We are not here to perform. We are here to confront.

This is not about hype, lights, or loud speakers.
This is about confronting powers and principalities.

We are not gathering for chill bumps.
We are gathering to challenge darkness.

"The kingdom of God is not in word but in power." 1 Corinthians 4:20

"These signs will follow those who believe... in My name they will cast out demons." Mark 16:17

If we never confront the devil, we have no right to complain about him.

Authority that is never exercised becomes irrelevant.

Demonstration must follow declaration.

2. Deliverance belongs to the desperate

There is no record in Scripture of prideful people receiving deliverance.
Freedom begins where pride ends.

It does not matter your title, age, success, or platform.
No one is exempt from spiritual warfare.

"The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit." Psalm 51:17

"Even the dogs eat the crumbs which fall from their master's table." Mark 7:28

Deliverance does not walk. It crawls.

If you care more about your image than your freedom, you are not ready.

Breakthrough comes to the hungry, not the casual.

3. If we stop casting out demons, the kingdom is not advancing

Jesus went from synagogue to synagogue casting out demons.
Deliverance was normal ministry for Him.

When demons are confronted, the kingdom is present.
When demons are ignored, religion replaces power.

"If I cast out demons by the finger of God, surely the kingdom of God has come upon you." Luke 11:20

You cannot preach the kingdom and avoid the battle.

A church that entertains but does not deliver is not advancing.

We are called to be an army, not a circus.

4. Demons thrive in camouflage

The enemy does not always scream.
He whispers.

He hides in thoughts, patterns, compulsions, and shame.

If the enemy remains undetected, he remains undefeated.



"For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood." Ephesians 6:12

**When something in you feels foreign to who you truly are in Christ, confront it.
Not every struggle is just personality.
Spiritual battles require spiritual solutions.**

5. Surrender is the doorway to freedom

Jesus never begged people to follow Him.
He demanded everything.

Partial surrender produces partial freedom.
Total surrender invites total transformation.

"If anyone desires to come after Me, let him deny himself." Luke 9:23

"The kingdom of heaven is like treasure hidden in a field... he sells all that he has and buys that field." Matthew 13:44

God does not want 99 percent.

Freedom costs pride.

You cannot keep inviting what you are asking God to remove.

6. Unforgiveness keeps doors open

Before deliverance, deal with bitterness.
Release those who hurt you.

The devil does not play fair.
But forgiveness shuts legal access.

"Forgive, and you will be forgiven." Luke 6:37

"Do not give place to the devil." Ephesians 4:27

Unforgiveness is a chain.

You cannot hold bitterness and expect freedom.

Close the door before commanding spirits to leave.

7. The altar is a place of decision

This is not about emotion.
This is about eviction.

Desperation says

I do not care who prays for me.

I do not care how I look.

I just want freedom.
