



1. Revival begins when we see what has always been true.

Isaiah did not create revival. He simply saw the Lord clearly.
Revival is not new methods. It is renewed vision.
God has always been holy. We just need eyes to see.

“Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts; the whole earth is full of His glory.” Isaiah 6:3

“In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord.” Isaiah 6:1

Revival starts when your eyes open.

God is closer than you think and better than you know.

One glimpse of His glory can change your destiny.

2. Expectation is the doorway to impartation.

We receive according to what we believe God will do.
When the church gathers hungry, heaven responds.
You can have more of God than you currently have.

“He began to proclaim in Decapolis all that Jesus had done for him.” Mark 5:20

There is a miracle inside the miracle.

Your obedience today can shift cities tomorrow.

Personal freedom can become regional transformation.

4. Storms often signal a significant destination.

Before breakthrough, there was resistance.
The storm came because the mission mattered.
Opposition often confirms calling.

“He rebuked the wind and the raging water.” Luke 8:24

“The gates of hell shall not prevail against the church.” Matthew 16:18

If the enemy fights your journey, your destination is powerful.

The storm is proof you are headed somewhere important.

Resistance reveals relevance.



5. Authority flows from submission and leads to follow-through.

The issue in Gadara was not strength but authority.

Authority comes from being under God's rule.

Breakthrough must be married to obedience.

"All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to Me." Matthew 28:18

"Go home to your friends and tell them what great things the Lord has done for you." Mark 5:19

In order to have authority over something, you must be submitted under God.

If you do not marry breakthrough to follow-through, you will live conference to conference.
